



BDCA POLICY No.D-3

Club Colours & Playing Attire

Purpose

This policy is to provide clubs with a criteria and procedures for approval of Club Colours playing attire.

Scope

This policy is to demonstrate to member clubs that the BDCA wishes have a uniform standard of playing attire that conforms to the playing format and conditions of it competitions. Approval of club colours is to avoid any duplication or clash of colours.

Criteria for Normal Competition with the Red Ball

1. The playing kit is to be predominantly white.
2. Sponsorship is allowed on the shirt without being dominant on the strip as to create a conflict with the red cricket ball.
3. Sponsorship logos are to be approved by the BDCA Executive Committee.

Criteria for T20 Competitions with the White or Coloured Ball

1. The playing kit can reflect club colours.
2. The colours and sponsorship logos on the strip are not to create a conflict with the colour of the cricket ball used for the respective competition.

Approval Procedures

1. If a member club is not using the traditional all white kit for playing in the Normal Competition they are to submit a diagram of their proposed strip to the BDCA Executive Committee for approval.
2. Designs for Coloured clothing for T20 competitions are also to be submitted to the BDCA for approval
3. The BDCA will examine each submission with the above mentioned criteria.
4. A presentation of club colours and logos must be submitted to the BDCA Executive for approval.
5. The secretary of the Association will advise the club of their decision regarding each submission.
